MIDDLE SCHOOL

TECHNOLOGY REQUIREMENTS

- **All students will require a LAPTOP COMPUTER or tablet with a keyboard** (Dell, HP, Lenovo, Toshiba, MacBook, MacBook Air, etc) or Chromebook (Note Chromebook may not work with some Applications)
- **NOTE** iPhones, iPods and most iPads are not suitable for writing extensive text
- Headphones for personal use
- A TI-Graphing Calculator (84 Plus recommended, 84 Plus C or CE saves on batteries) for Grade 8
- Some Spanish classes may require a headphone set with a microphone. You will be advised at the start of semester before whether your child needs one.

HIGH SCHOOL

TECHNOLOGY REQUIREMENTS

- **All students will require a LAPTOP COMPUTER** (Dell, HP, Lenovo, Toshiba, MacBook, MacBook Air, etc) or Chromebook (Note Chromebook may not work with some Applications)
NOT iPhone or iPod / iPad)
- Headphones for personal use.
- **Graphing Calculator TI-84 model Silver plus Edition*** (It should have Inverse Trig Functions and Standard Deviation Feature / Stat plots option) or any other Graphing Calculator approved by College Board for AP and SAT Exam.

VERY IMPORTANT: This calculator can be difficult / impossible to find (and more expensive) in Guatemala. If you don't have one, start looking right away. Many families purchase one from Amazon, in the U.S. or have friends or family bring one to Guatemala for them. Please do NOT purchase a calculator that requires a charger, as they frequently run out of charge and die. Purchase one with batteries. Please note that all editions of the TI-84 Plus are all acceptable versions; however, a few of the programs distributed in class will not work on the regular TI-84. Additionally, all demonstrations with a calculator will use a TI-84 Plus, so if your child has a Casio or different version calculator, I will not be able to help them with their calculator.

- *****Review book** (Recommended for AP WORLD HISTORY, **NOT needed** for REGULAR WORLD HISTORY) Best review book is Princeton Review's Cracking the AP World History Exam.

- Review book recommended (**NOT needed for *REGULAR COMPARATIVE GOVERNMENT***)

PE CLOTHING GUIDELINES

An essential element that contributes to a student's success and safety in PE is the wearing of appropriate footwear and clothing. Please make sure your child comes to PE with clothing that is conducive to movement - and shoes that are safe for running, jumping, kicking, and moving.

MIDDLE SCHOOL

The dress standards for physical education activity classes in the middle school are to be in line with the same dress code that is school appropriate for everyday wear and should include the following: Shorts or athletic pants, t-shirt or long sleeve shirt, socks, and athletic shoes (Crocs and Converse are not suitable for athletic shoes). To prevent injury it is important that students wear proper athletic shoes conducive to running and jumping. Often times running is done outside in wet field conditions therefore it is recommended that students bring a change of socks and shoes as well as a change of clothes.

Students will be required to change out of their PE clothes and into their school clothes after PE class. All PE wear must conform to the school dress code. Students will be required to change into their PE clothes before class and out of them into their regular clothes at the end of class (if students have PE 1st period then they may come to school in their PE clothes but **MUST** change into their school clothes after PE) A shower is optional if students choose to take advantage of this option before changing back into their school clothing. If your child would like to shower he/she should bring a towel and toiletries. For hygiene purposes, carrying deodorant, perfume/cologne or other toiletries that contribute to a positive hygiene experience are recommended. Girls may also want to make sure they bring a sports bra for athletic activities.
